

COVID-19 Vaccine Facts: Pregnancy and Breastfeeding





WHY GET VACCINATED FOR COVID-19

- Vaccination is the BEST way to protect your newborn against serious health problems from COVID-19. When you are vaccinated, you pass protection against COVID-19 to your baby even before they are born.
- Vaccination lowers your risk of getting very sick with COVID-19 while pregnant. Pregnant people with COVID-19 are more likely to get very sick and be hospitalized or give birth earlier than those without COVID-19.
- The COVID-19 vaccine has been updated to protect against current circulating strains of COVID-19. The vaccine is recommended during pregnancy and breastfeeding by every major maternal health organization.

WHEN TO GET VACCINATED

It is important to stay up to date with your COVID-19 vaccine when you are pregnant.

- You can get the updated COVID-19 vaccine at any stage of your pregnancy and when you are breastfeeding.
- You can get the COVID-19 vaccine at the same time as other vaccines recommended during pregnancy, including flu, Tdap, and RSV.



VACCINES ARE SAFE FOR PREGNANT PEOPLE.

- Studies and safety monitoring of people who were vaccinated while they were pregnant showed no increased risk of pregnancy complications or birth defects.
- None of the COVID-19 vaccines contain the live virus. The vaccines cannot give COVID to you or your baby.
