## Notes on Listed Agenda Items

### Item 1: Welcome

Members joined the Microsoft Teams Meeting call at 4:00 PM. The meeting was opened by facilitator Susan Harden.

### Item 2: Community Engagement and Communication

CAG members provided an update on the meeting they had with Supervisor Katherine Barger's office. A CAG member announced that Supervisor Barger was supportive of obtaining all data related to the Aliso Canyon blowout. Additionally, a CAG member shared that the Supervisor agreed the community should have full disclosure of what the Aliso Canyon waste bins contained and what the waste bins were tested for. Another CAG member added that Supervisor Barger's office would forward all meeting information to Public Health.

### Item 3: Scientific Oversight Committee

Ms. Vaculik provided an update on the progress on the Health Study goals and priorities being developed by the SOC. The SOC has been reviewing community feedback, and the Community Opinion Survey results. SOC member Dr. Jeffrey Nordella requested the SOC meeting minutes and expressed concern about the process of developing the Health Study goals and priorities.

### Item 4: Other / Requested Updates & Next Steps

Ms. Vaculik informed CAG members that the questions emailed from CAG members regarding 31 bins of soil contaminated with Volatile Organic Chemicals (VOC's) that were removed from the Aliso Canyon gas storage facility in 2016 were forwarded to South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) for review.

With regard to the 150 bins containing soil and materials of the Aliso Canyon blowout and well-control attempts, Ms. Vaculik mentioned they are being removed from the facility and transported offsite. Charlene Contreras, Director of Toxicology and Environmental Assessment, explained that the waste bins have to be disposed of in a safe manner, in accordance with federal and state regulations, because they contain hazardous materials. A CAG member expressed concern about the transportation of the waste bins through the streets of the neighboring communities. Public Health explained that the SoCalGas company or contractor has to follow stringent regulations for the transport of hazardous waste.

Ms. Vaculik shared information on several of the state and federal regulatory agencies that are involved in the oversight of the Aliso Canyon gas storage facility and Ms. Contreras added that a

table with all regulatory agencies and their regulatory jurisdiction can be developed and provided to the public.

In response to concerns raised by members of the community, Public Health will have the Radiation Management team visit the Aliso Canyon facility to take measurements. Ms. Vaculik will inquire with Public Health's Radiation Management team to gain a better understanding of the measurement and reporting timeline.
