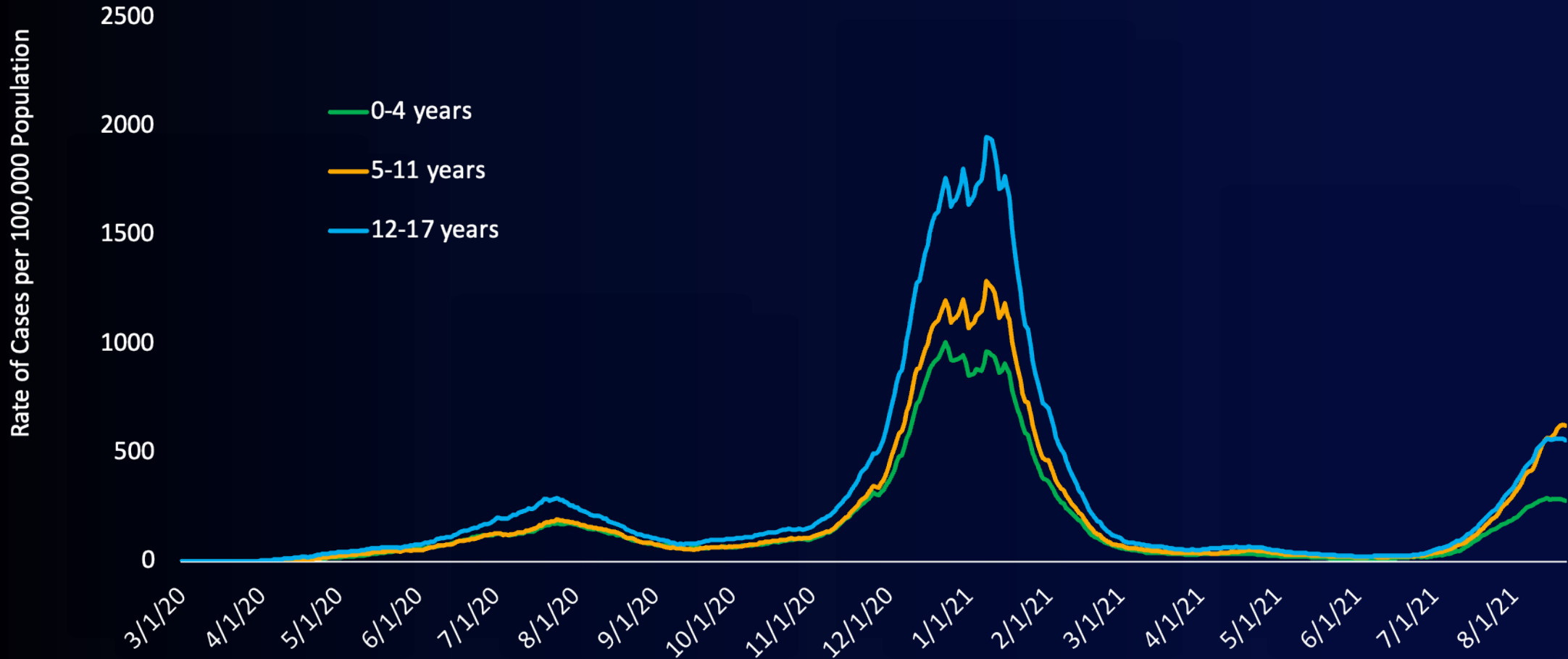


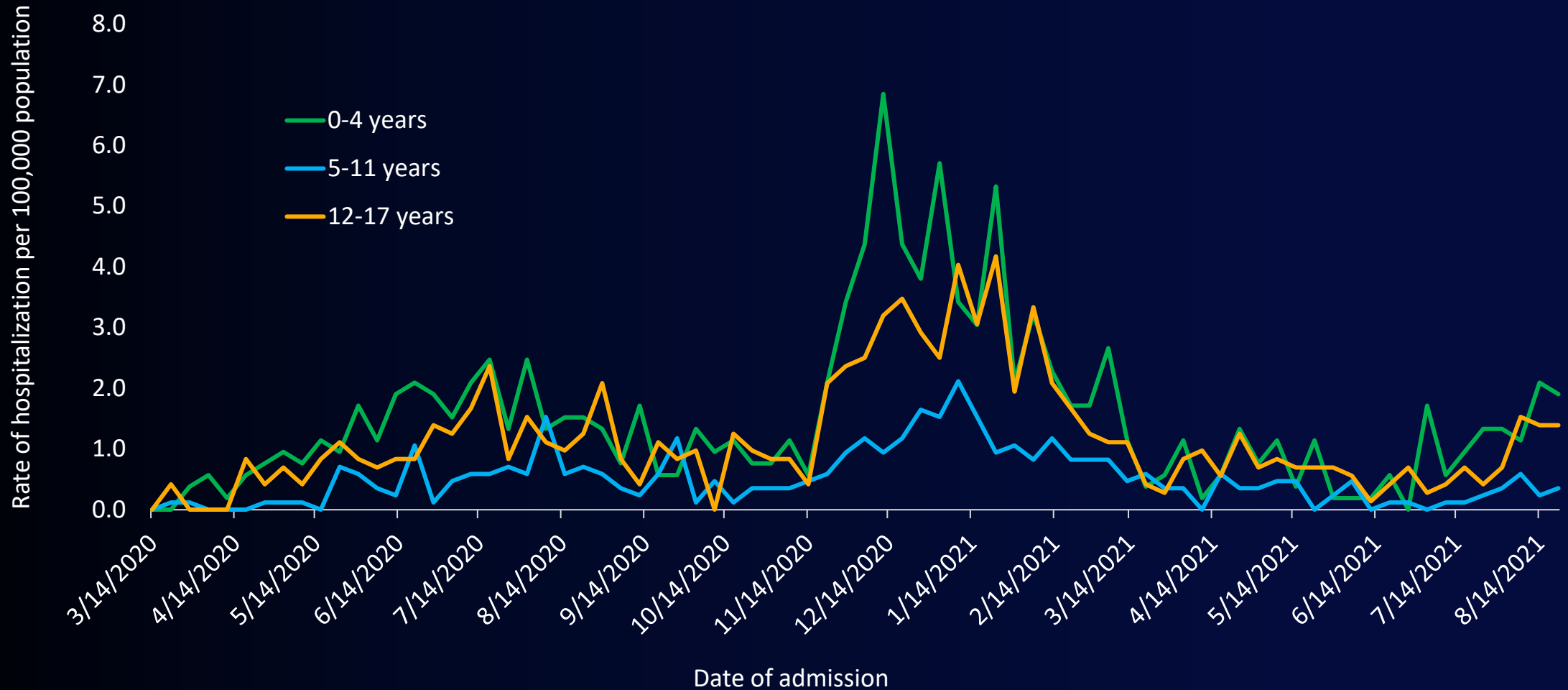
Weekly Rate of Cases Per 100,000 by Pediatric Age Group March 1, 2020 - August 21, 2021



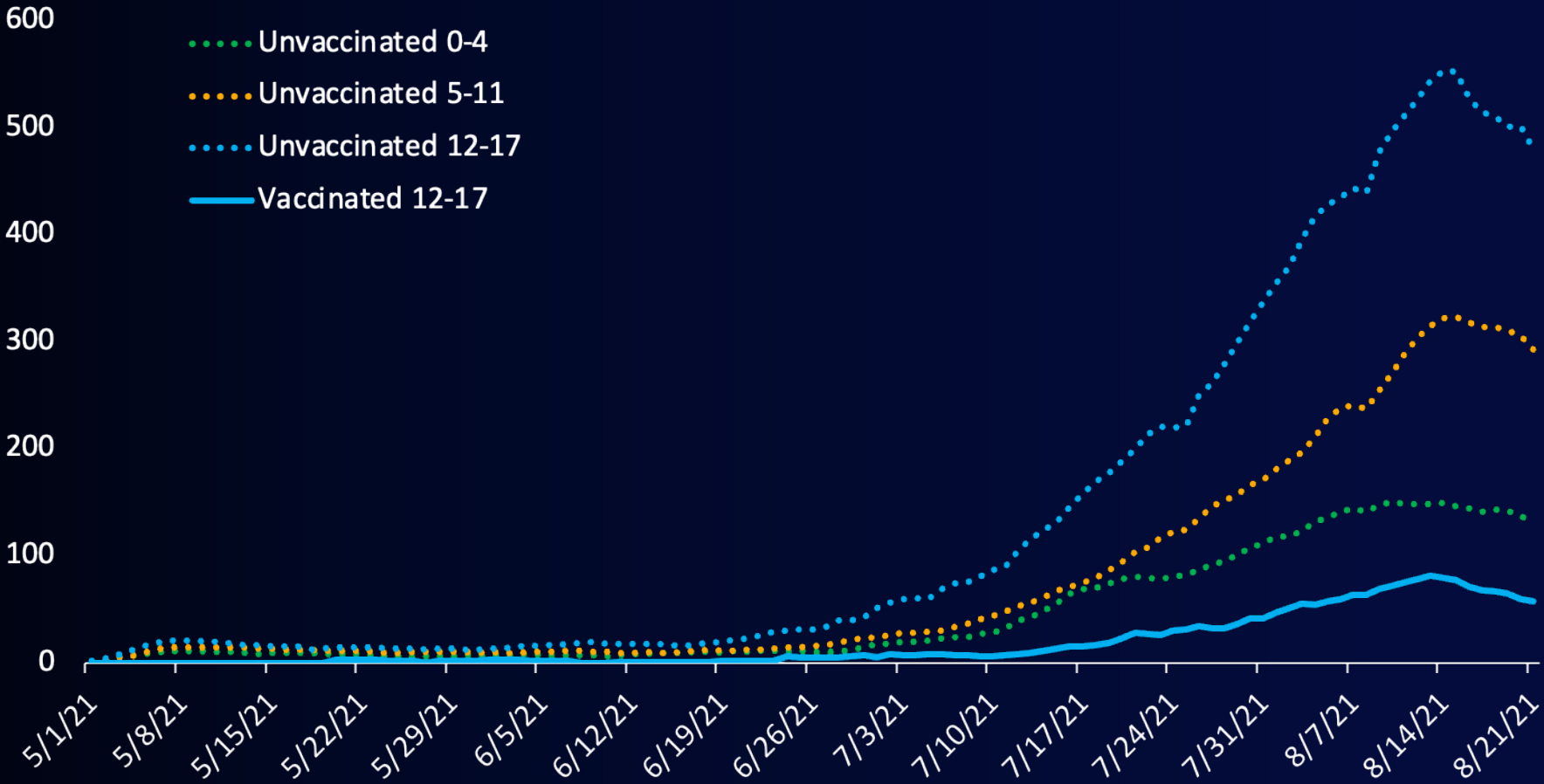

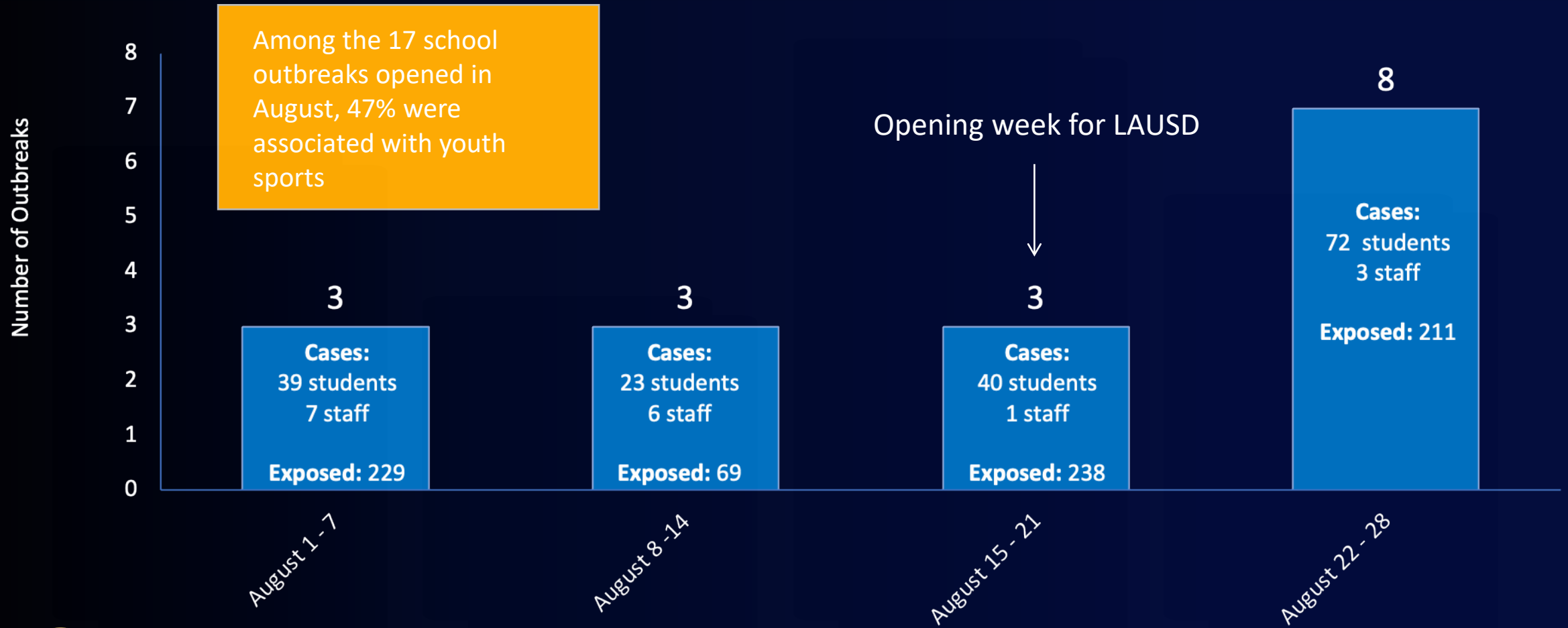

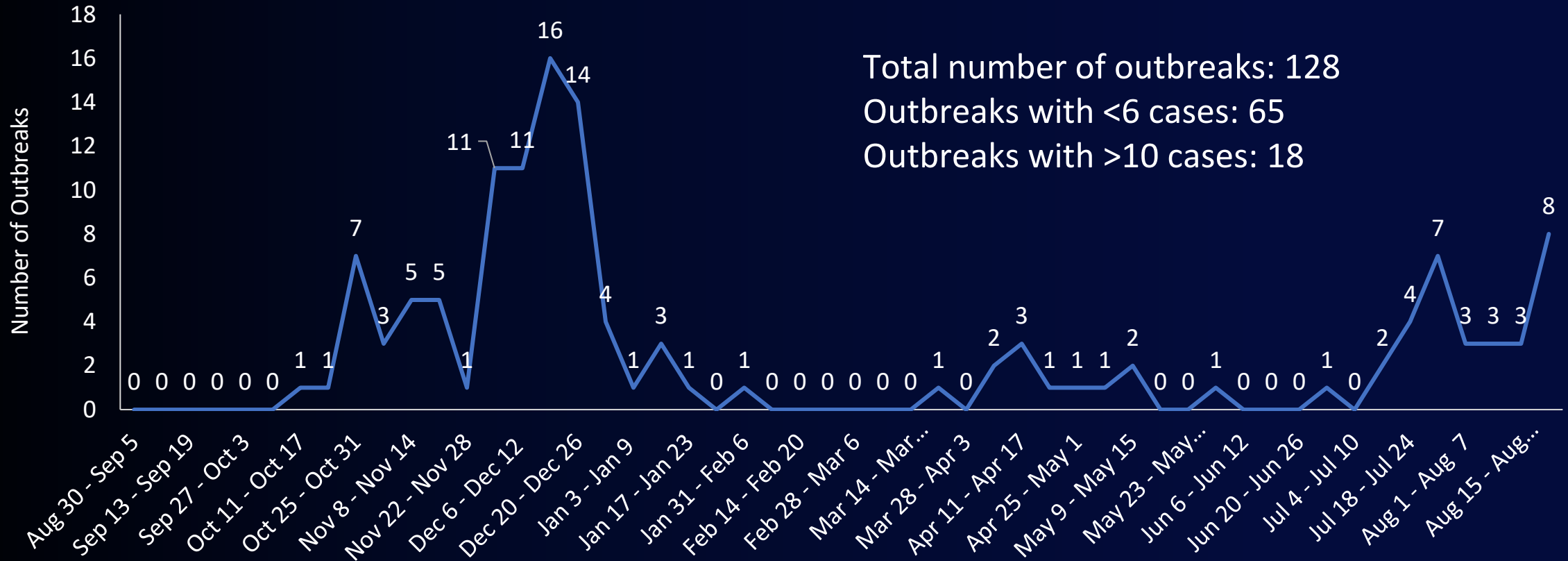
COVID-19 Outbreaks in LAC K-12 Schools and Programs by Week

School Outbreaks since August 15th, 2021

There have been 8 outbreaks in classroom settings:

- 7 staff
- 117 students
- 1 hospitalization

Risk factors for transmission:

- Inconsistent and incorrect mask use indoors at school
- Lack of physical distancing outside of classrooms (e.g. in hallways, cafeterias, breakrooms, playgrounds)
- Lack of physical distancing inside classrooms
- Lack of ventilation measures
- Symptomatic people on site



Best Practices for Reducing School Transmission

Masking, distancing, and source/infection control

- Ensure mask wearing indoors and in crowded spaces outdoors
- Set up satellite food distribution points and entry points to avoid crowding in lines
- Use symptom screening at entry to schools to ensure that those feeling ill are not at school
- Sanitize restrooms and shared space frequently

Maximize airflow

- Ventilate, ventilate, ventilate indoor space
- Do not position classroom desks in pods; have students instead sit all facing the same direction
- Move breakfast and lunch feeding programs outdoors where feasible and add canopies to protect from inclement weather
- Open windows and doors and upgrade HVAC systems to maximize the circulation of outdoor air

Simplify case identification and contact tracing

- Participate in weekly testing programs if feasible
- Use seating charts for every class
- In younger grades, keep students in stable cohorts without mixing during PE, recess, and lunch
- Keep good records of vaccination status for each staff and student to limit quarantining those fully vaccinated

Messaging and information-sharing

- Use signage reminders everywhere
- Share COVID-19 school plans with staff, parents and students so everyone knows the rules and expectations
- Host sessions for parents and students on COVID safety strategies
- Contact DPH teams for help and support

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Contact Tracing in Schools

After the confirmed COVID-19 case is identified and isolated:

1	Identify close contacts	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Close contacts have a total of 15 minutes exposure within 6 feet of a positive case over a day• Students and staff meeting the close contact criteria are identified by schools with support from DPH.
2	Notify close contacts and instruct to quarantine	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Fully vaccinated individuals do not need to quarantine.• DPH will work with schools to determine quarantine period.
3	Release close contacts from quarantine	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Close contacts are released from quarantine and return to school.



Youth Sports Guidance

Vaccination	Strongly recommended for all student athletes 12+, coaches, team staff
Face Coverings	Required indoors for participants, spectators, coaches, and employees, regardless of vaccination status , even while engaging in physical activity <ul style="list-style-type: none">• May remove masks when eating/drinking (maintain distance) and in water during indoor water sports• Unvaccinated employees must be provided with respirators and should double-mask/ wear respirator• Recommended in crowded outdoor spaces (and required at outdoor events attended by >10,000)
Symptom screening and isolation	Ask participants and families to self-screen for Covid-19 symptoms Required to exclude or isolate symptomatic participants, coaches, and spectators, notify DPH of cases immediately
Distancing	Reduce crowding and sustained person-to-person contact / move outdoors wherever possible
Ventilation	For indoor activities, consider modifications to maximize air filtration or open windows/doors and consider fans During transit in team buses/vans, open windows when safe
Handwashing	Place handwashing stations or hand sanitizer at entry and outside communal bathrooms



Modified Youth Sports Testing Guidance

Testing

Weekly testing is **not required** for :

- **Fully vaccinated** or recently infected (past 90 days) participants and personnel if **asymptomatic**
- Participants **<12 years in outdoor low, moderate or high-risk sports**
 - Weekly testing is still *recommended, where possible*, for this age group; weekly school testing fulfills this
 - During multi-county, multi-day competitions, a negative test within 3 days prior to first game is *recommended* for these participants

Weekly testing is **required** for:

- **Unvaccinated** participants (all ages) and personnel in **indoor moderate or high-risk sports**
- **Unvaccinated** participants **12 and older** and personnel in **outdoor moderate or high-risk sports**
- **Fully vaccinated** participants and personnel if there is a **confirmed case** among a team, in which case test weekly x2 weeks

We have removed the requirement that athletes and staff members test negative within 72 hours of inter-team competition

School, coach or league must keep records of vaccination verification and weekly testing



What We Can Do to Keep Schools Open and Safe

- Vaccinate eligible children and staff
- Keep sick children home
- Participate in routine screening testing where available
- Participate in contact tracing – and follow isolation and quarantine orders
- Mask up
