





Rapid flu test decreases antibiotic use in hospitalized adults

A new study reports that hospitalized adult patients who had early testing for influenza were given antibiotics less frequently than patients whose flu was identified later. (Arch Intern Med. 2007 Jan 22)

Influenza Activity: CA & USA

From 1/7/07-1/13/07 (week 2), laboratory surveillance for influenza increased slightly in the United States, while influenza-like illness (ILI) data was at baseline. The percent of deaths due to pneumonia and influenza remained below baseline level.

Influenza activity in California remains **local** (influenza outbreaks detected or an increase in ILI and recent laboratoryconfirmed influenza in a single region of the state).
