



Influenza Vaccine Coverage Low in Pediatric Asthma Patients

This report provides the first national estimate of influenza vaccination coverage in asthmatic children. Although children with asthma were more likely to receive influenza vaccination, the vaccination coverage rate among children with asthma was low (29%).

Influenza Activity: CA & USA

California: During Week 11 (March 11 – 17, 2007), overall influenza activity declined compared to previous weeks and influenza activity in California was downgraded to **local**.

United States: Influenza activity continued to decrease in the United States. The reporting of widespread or regional influenza activity decreased from 42 to 37 from week 10 to 11.
