





Current Status

 Influenza activity is leveling off in Los Angeles County, California, and the United States.

•Peak activity in Los Angeles occurred between 2/9/08-2/23/08

•Influenza activity was higher than 2006-2007 but within 5year norms.

•RSV was low compared to the past several years.

In the News

The ACIP recommended that all children in the United States (age 6 months-18 years) receive yearly influenza vaccinations. Children <9 years who are receiving the vaccine for the first time need 2 doses. LAIV is an alternative to using needles in healthy children 2-18 years. (www.cdc.qov/flu/)

Influenza Activity: CA & USA

California: During week 12 (3/16/08-3/22/08), influenza activity in California was **Regional**. Admissions for ILI admissions and prescriptions for antivirals decreased in Northern and Southern California. United States: The level of influenza activity decreased throughout the US during week 12 (3/16/08-3/22/08). Only17 states reported **widespread** influenza.
