
January Observances

Cervical Health Awareness Month

While cervical cancer rates in the United States have dropped over the past few decades, it has been estimated that approximately 13,820 individuals were diagnosed with cervical cancer in 2024, and over 4,360 died from the disease.

For the most part, cervical cancer is a preventable disease. Nearly all cases of cervical cancer are caused by infections with high-risk strains of the human papillomavirus (HPV). Fortunately, the HPV vaccine currently used in the United States, Gardasil 9, can protect against nine of the 12 high-risk HPV strains.

The HPV vaccine is approved for males and females ages 9 to 45, with recommendations that they should get the first dose at age 11 or 12.



In addition to preventative vaccines, we have screening tests that can detect cancer at an early stage, when treatment is more effective than at a later point. Even precancerous conditions can be detected and treated. Screening includes the well-known "Pap test" or "Pap smear."

Most health insurances cover the cost of all recommended vaccines, including the HPV vaccine. If you are interested, please speak to your medical provider. If you are uninsured or underinsured, there are programs available to help cover the cost of vaccines.

If you are uninsured or underinsured, there are programs available to help cover the cost of vaccines. Children who are 18 years of age or younger are eligible to receive vaccines at no cost through the Vaccines for Children (VFC) Program if they are:

- Eligible for or are enrolled in Medi-Cal
- American Indian or Alaskan Native
- Uninsured (do not have health insurance)
- Underinsured (private health insurance does not cover the full cost of vaccines)

Uninsured or underinsured adults can access free or low-cost vaccines at select clinics enrolled in the Vaccines for Adults (VFA) program. National Birth Defects Awareness/Prevention Month

Every 4.5 minutes a baby is born with a condition that affects the structure or function of their body

- these conditions are referred to as birth defects. While "birth defect" is a medical term, it does not mean that an individual is "defective."

Birth defects can happen for many reasons, and we cannot prevent them all. However, there are steps a pregnant person can take to give the baby a great start:

- Take charge of existing health conditions, such as diabetes or high blood pressure
- See a healthcare professional regularly
- Avoid alcohol, smoking, and other recreational drugs

- Talk to a healthcare professional about any medication you take
- Try to prevent infections

Although no two people living with these conditions are exactly alike, many are lifelong and require lifelong care. A community of support can help people with these conditions, no matter what health experiences they are navigating. Community plays an important role in the lives of people and their families affected by birth defects. For families navigating this journey, connecting with others who share similar experiences can be a helpful source of support and understanding. This connection may be in person or through internet groups hosted by condition-specific organizations.

Additionally, a community-wide focus on inclusion encourages an environment of acceptance that benefits everyone. Disability inclusion means understanding the relationship between the way people function and how they can participate in society.

Human Trafficking Prevention Month

January is National Human Trafficking Prevention Month. This month is dedicated to raising awareness about human trafficking and to educating the public about how to identify and prevent this crime.

Human trafficking, also known as trafficking in persons, includes both forced labor and sex trafficking. It robs millions of their dignity and freedom, enriches transnational criminals and terrorists, and threatens public safety and national security everywhere. [There are estimated to be more than 27.6 million people — adults and children — subjected to human trafficking around the world, including in the United States.](#)



People may be at-risk to trafficking if they:

- Have an unstable living situation
- Have previously experienced other forms of violence such as sexual abuse or domestic violence
- Have run away or are involved in the juvenile justice or child welfare system
- Are facing poverty or economic need
- Have a caregiver or family member who has a substance use issue
- Are addicted to drugs or alcohol

To report your concerns about a potential trafficking situation or get help for a person who may be a victim, contact the following helplines:



In 2025, OVP is committed to distributing more than 60,000 cable gun locks – free of charge and no questions asked – across Los Angeles County. This unprecedented effort is designed to keep children safe from firearms, limit the possibility that a person intent on harming themselves or others can quickly secure a loaded, unlocked weapon, and guard against the theft of guns. LA Health Portal E-Visits

Need care now? An eVisit is a quick, convenient online care choice for common medical concerns. An eVisit gives patients access to care from a provider who can order tests and/or medicines without a trip to the doctor's office. eVisits are a great choice for common medical concerns like:

- Cold or Flu
- Headache
- Muscle Aches
- Skin Rash
- Sore Throat
- Urinary Problems
- Vaginal Problems



How it works

- Sign in to LA Health Portal and fill out an eVisit form.
- Get a response email from a provider within 1 hour from 8 am to 8 pm, 7 days a week.*
- The provider will answer your questions and order tests and/or medicines if needed.

*E-visits sent after 8 pm will receive an answer the following day.

Community Public Health Teams

Community Public Health Teams (CPHT) is a project that brings together community-based organizations, health care partners, and Public Health staff. These teams work at the household level, conducting home visits to gather health needs and connect people to care and also works at the community level, inviting people to participate in creating community action plans.

This is a new approach to public health and health care in LA County. Public Health is investing public health infrastructure dollars to implement this pilot project for five years, beginning August 2023. The goal is to build long-term relationships with households, empower communities to define the health priorities that matter to them, and demonstrate that this new way of engagement can support better health outcomes.



5 CORE STRATEGIES

Each CPHT implements five core strategies:

-  Visit each household annually to conduct household assessments
-  Ensure households are connected to health care and social services
-  Analyze data on health, mental health, and social determinants of health
-  Convene community and develop community action plans
-  Mobilize partners to advance health equity and improve conditions

Angelenos in Action

Join Angelenos in Action, a voluntary public health survey that takes less than 1-minute each week and helps the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health monitor respiratory illness throughout the County.

Here's how it works:

1. Text "@PROTECT" to (833) 228-3056 to volunteer for our survey or sign up online using this link: <http://tinyurl.com/ys6se6we>.
2. Answer 5 quick questions to sign up.
3. You will be randomized to receive surveys one day a week.
4. Every week on that day, the LA County Department of Public Health will text or email you one YES/NO question to ask how you're feeling.
5. If you feel unwell, you will be asked two more YES/NO questions about symptoms of respiratory illness.

Office of Violence Prevention - GVRO's (Gun Violence Restraining Orders)



A Gun Violence Restraining Order, or GVRO, is a law that was approved by the State of California in 2016. The GVRO allows family members, household members, some employers, colleagues, teachers, and law enforcement to take action to prevent a person who poses a significant risk of harming themselves or others from having or purchasing a
