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Medical Care Coordination

Medical Care Coordination (MCC) is a multi-disciplinary team approach to help patients improve health outcomes.





Key Objectives

- To promote linkage to and retention in medical care
- To identify and remove barriers to treatment adherence
- To improve health outcomes
- To streamline service delivery / coordination
 - Eliminate duplication of services



MCC Team

- Medical Care Manager
 - Registered Nurse

- Patient Care Manager
 - Master's in Social Work, Psychology, etc.

- Case Worker
 - Bachelor's level staff / LVN





Target Population for MCC

- HIV+ individuals who:
 - Newly diagnosed
 - Intermittently in or out of care
 - Have a viral load of >200 ml/copy
 - Have multiple and complex co-occurring conditions that negatively affect a patient's health status.
 - Continue to exhibit high risk behaviors for transmission / re-infection HIV/STI





Program Design

- Eligibility screening
- Comprehensive Collaborative Assessment
- Acuity Determination
 - Sever, High, Moderate, Self-Managed
- Integrated care plan
- Multi-disciplinary case conferencing
- Provision of Brief Interventions

Non Medical Interventions

- Risk Reduction Counseling
- Linkages to Support Services
- Disclosure of HIV Status
- Mental Health and Substance Use Screening & Linkages



Medical Interventions

- Co Infections, including STIs
- Tx Side Effects
- Nutrition
- Adherence
- Patient Education
