- Elton Naswood, Red Circle Project of AIDS Project Los Angeles (APLA), extended his gratitude to the PPC Steering Subcommittee and members of the PPC and community who helped to develop the recommendations for the API/NA population in Los Angeles County.
- Elton Naswood, Red Circle Project of AIDS Project Los Angeles (APLA), announced March 20th is National Native American AIDS Awareness Day (NNAAAD) and in recognition of NNAAAD, the Red Circle Project is hosting its second annual Pow Wow on March 17th at Plummer Park in West Hollywood.

V. COMMUNITY CO-CHAIRS REPORT

• Asian Pacific Islander/Native American (API/NA) Recommendations Michelle Enfield and Kimler Gutierrez, co-chairs of the API/NA provided an overview about the development of the API/NA Task Force and the API/NA Recommendations. A copy of the API/NA Recommendations was included in the meeting packet and additional copies were placed on the back table. Michelle Enfield read the API/NA Recommendations. Motion #3 on the February 2, 2012 PPC meeting agenda to adopt and move forward with the recommendations developed by the Asian Pacific Islander/Native American Task Force was seconded by Michelle Enfield.

Urban Coalition of HIV/AIDS Prevention Services (UCHAPS) Update
Ricky Rosales shared he and Anthony Gutierrez attended the UCHAPS meeting last month.
The topics of discussion were the following: restructuring planning bodies (Mr. Rosales shared Los Angeles is working toward developing an integrated Plan as opposed to merging planning bodies), a short discussion on the federal government's renewed ban on Syringe

Exchange, the regular UCHAPS updates, and the next UCHAPS meeting is March 29th-March 30th. There was a brief question and answer period following the UCHAPS update.

• Prevention Prioritization Discussion

Ricky Rosales stated that included in the meeting packet is a copy of a presentation titled "Spatial Analysis of HIV and STD Disease Burden" previously given to the PPC. The group was given a few minutes to review the previous presentation. Motion #4 on the February 2, 2012 PPC meeting agenda to endorse the use of geo-spacial analysis for targeting HIV prevention services was seconded by Terry Smith. Michael Green provided some background on the motion indicating the Division of HIV and STD Programs (DHSP) can use a number of statistical and mapping programs to lay over data to identify specific neighborhoods in Los Angeles County that have higher disease burden. There was a lengthy discussion. AJ King offered a substitute motion "to endorse the use of geo-spatial analysis as one tool for targeting HIV prevention services". Terry Smith seconded the revised motion. The group agreed to accept the revised motion. A roll call vote was taken.

VI. GOVERNMENTAL CO-CHAIRS REPORT

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Site Visit

• HIV Testing at Walgreens

Ms. Rumanes announced in collaboration with Walgreens Pharmacies (HIV Centers of Excellence), DHSP launched HIV testing on January 26th at three Walgreens sites (Long Beach Blvd.,Crenshaw Blvd across from the Mall, and Slauson Ave.). HIV testing will be offered at these three sites on the last Thursday of each month from 1:00 PM to 7:00 PM. There was a question and answer period following the update. The addresses for the three locations will be forwarded through the PPC list serv.

VIII. LAC TLC+ FRAMEWORK AND STRATEGIES

Sophia Rumanes introduced Dr. Jennifer Sayles, DHSP Medical Director, who provided a power point presentation titled "Treatment as Prevention: LA County TLC+ Framework". The presentation included TLC+ as a holistic approach to HIV prevention, medical care, and supportive services. It also cited key evidence and provided data and statistics for where Los Angeles is in this process. A copy of the power point presentation titled "Treatment as Prevention: LA County TLC+ Framework" is on file. There was a question and answer period following the presentation.

IX. EARLY IDENTIFICATION OF INDIVIDUALS WITH HIV/AIDS (EIIHA) DISCUSSION

Anthony Gutierrez introduced Michael Green, PPC Governmental Co-Chair, who provided background information and an overview of Early Identification of Individuals with HIV/AIDS (EIIHA). In 2010 the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA), the funders of the Ryan White Program introduced EIIHA in an attempt to capture some prevention related information from the fifty-six jurisdictions, which are funded by the Ryan White Part A program. HRSA developed some guidance around EIIHA to attempt to capture information around prevention and screening and linkage activities, which historically have not been supported by Ryan White funds, but are taking place in jurisdictions where Ryan White funds are being received. The concept was introduced in 2010 and the guidance was refined for the 2011 Ryan White application, submitted by DHSP in October 2011. The purpose of the EIIHA section of the Ryan White application is to take a look at existing programs and services around screening and identifying infection and linking people who are diagnosed to appropriate medical services.

In jurisdictions such as Los Angeles County, who are directly funded by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), EIIHA activities were being already supported. The EIIHA matrix shows a description of Los Angeles County's existing prevention linkage to care network, describing systems already in place.

The Unmet Need section of the 2011 Ryan White application could be helpful in developing the Los Angeles County Comprehensive HIV Plan.

There were no questions after Michael Green's overview.
