Are you PrEPared?



If you are <u>sexually active</u>, ask your healthcare provider for more information. Consider starting PrEP (pre-exposure prophylaxis) if you:

- Have anal or vaginal sex without condoms with a partner(s) and don't know their HIV status.
- Have had a sexual transmitted infection (STI) in the past 6 months, especially syphilis or rectal gonorrhea or chlamydia.
- Use methamphetamine or share needles, syringes, or other equipment to inject drugs.
- Are planning to get pregnant with a partner who has HIV or whose HIV status you don't know.

PrEP is a medication that helps reduce your risk of getting HIV.
