Webinar Overview

Antiretroviral drugs are an increasingly important component of HIV prevention, as they can reduce viral loads and infectiousness of persons living with HIV (i.e., "treatment as prevention") and help prevent HIV acquisition in uninfected persons (i.e., "biomedical prevention"). Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) is one form of HIV biomedical prevention. Although PrEP has been shown to decrease risk of HIV by up to 99% when taken daily as prescribed, many medical providers are unaware that this prevention tool exists. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates that 1 in 3 primary care providers and nurses have never heard of PrEP. This webinar is designed to introduce providers to PrEP and provide them with the knowledge necessary to comfortably prescribe this prevention tool to their patients.

Target Audience

This activity is applicable for physicians in primary care and/or infectious disease specialists. Other groups who are encouraged to participate include nurses, epidemiologists, public health investigators, health educators, and community health workers.
