# **Screening Tests**

## 1. What are screening tests?

Screening tests look for diseases and other health conditions before you have symptoms. These tests help to find a disease or condition early, when it's easier to treat.

Screening tests also have risks. It's important to know which tests you need and how often you need them. Examples of screening tests are diabetes, high blood pressure, osteoporosis, breast and colon cancer.



### 2. What screening tests do I need?

Not everyone needs every screening test. The tests recommended for you depends on the disease and other factors. Other factors can include age, gender, race/ethnicity, family history, and behaviors such as smoking or sexual activity.

- Talk to your doctor about which tests are right for you. Ask the age you should start getting screened for each disease and the age you can stop.
- Beware of companies selling screening tests through newspaper ads, flyers or the internet. Some of these tests can waste your money. Sometimes they can also lead to harm. Talk to your doctor before getting these tests.
