Guidance for Clinicians

Check List: Managing Patients Suspected of Having Invasive Haemophilus Influenzae (H. Flu)

The purpose of this checklist is to provide clinicians step-by-step guidance for evaluating patients suspected to have invasive Haemophilus influenzae to reduce spread and facilitate Public Health investigations.

□ i	Identify Haemophilus influenzae (H.flu) from a sterile site Isolate organisms from cerebrospinal fluid (CSF), blood, joint fluid, pleural fluid, pericardial fluid, peritoneal fluid, subcutaneous tissue fluid, placenta, amniotic fluid, or other sterile sites.
Step 2. Isolate the patient under <u>droplet precautions</u>	
Step 3. Begin appropriate antimicrobials with an effective, third-generation cephalosporin (cefotaxime or ceftriaxone) immediately	
	Forward all sterile-site isolates to the Public Health Laboratory for serotyping Contact the Public Health Laboratory at (562) 658-1460 to schedule isolate pickup for serotyping.
Step 5. If <u>Hib or Hia</u> is probable or confirmed, identify and observe contacts at increased risk	
	 Identify whether the patient has been in recent contact with any of the following: Infants < 4 years of age who are unimmunized or incompletely immunized Immunocompromised persons
	Observe contacts, especially exposed children, for fever and other signs/symptoms. Rifampin chemoprophylaxis should be considered for high-risk contacts. Please see CDPH Quicksheet for more information.
Step 6. Assess the patient's immunization status	
	Vaccinate children aged <24 months who develop invasive Hib disease with a second primary series 4 weeks after disease onset regardless of previous Hib vaccination.
Step 7. Report the patient suspected of having invasive H. flu to Public Health	
	Inform the case-patient that Public Health may be in contact to provide H. flu-related assistance to them and their family/friends.
