





#### **Comments from Nurses Responding**

- Simplify the Asthma Action Plan (AAP). In-service Primary Health Provider on how to instruct student/parent regarding inhaler use and maintenance the use of Peak Flow meter and how to use the AAP form.
- Encourage pharmacists to review inhaler and spacer technique routinely with student/family.
- It is difficult enough to receive a physician authorization form completed more so for the nurse to obtain an AAP. The nurse should in-service the Health Provider's office on how to complete the AAP form.
- Continue participation with the asthma mobile units encourage families to obtain an AAP before the start of a new school year.
- Bring inhaler to school with proper documentation.
- Support the nurse's efforts to educate the PE teachers regarding LAUSD asthma policies.
- Continue to provide asthma education to students and parents how to manage their asthma.

Which school district do you work for?



Does the school have a standard emergency protocol for students in respiratory distress if they do not have their own asthma action plan?



#### Conclusions

• The estimated number of students with asthma and actual are comparable. Anywhere between 12% to 20% of student with asthma also have an AAP on file at school. So as much as 80% of student with asthma have no AAP on file in school on average.
