Purpose of this workgroup will be to develop objectives and to begin to talk about best practice models, by utilizing the Health and Human Rights framework. They will also look at addressing toxins in the home, which increases problems associated with asthma. Carrie (Outdoor Air Quality Workgroup) – Goal of this workgroup is to develop objectives and look and ways to help improve outdoor air quality. Yolanda (Schools Workgroup) – Goal is to get anyone who has a passion working with children to improve asthma and their school settings to be part of this workgroup. Looking to enforce some of the policies that have been put into place. Dr. Vinetz (Clinical Workgroup) – Purpose is to look at healthcare aspects both from preventive components as well as healthcare.
