# **COVID-19 Reporting Requirements**

### Brief Highlights (Revisions are highlighted in yellow):

#### 1/31/2025:

- Retains the requirement that hospitals continue reporting COVID-19 hospitalizations to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (LACDPH) than, the COVID-19 Hospitalization Electronic Surveillance System (CHESS).
- Returns COVID-19 case reporting requirements for all manuated reporters to current State regulatory requirements for reporting COVID-19 cases to the initial health officer. See, Title 17, California Code of Regulations, section 2500(j) for via although providers; section 2505 for laboratories; and section 2508 for schools and cast childhood education facilities.
- Rescinds the specific COVID-19 case an includer reporting requirements for Workplace Settings (employers), Skilled Nursing Facilities, Congregate Settings (Community Care Facilities, Inc. Congregate Residential Settings, and Educational Facilities.
- Employers are reminded that Subsection \$205(j) of the CalOSHA COVID-19 Prevention regulations, which deals with reporting are a sordkeeping, remains in effect until February 3, 2026. It continues requiring that employers keep a report of and track all COVID-19 cases with the employee's name, contact information, occuration lecation where the employee worked, the date of the last day at the workplace, and the date of the positive COVID-19 test and/or COVID-19 diagnosis. The records must be retained for the years beyond the period in which the record is necessary to meet the requirements of this section. It also requires that information on COVID-19 cases be provided to the local health deportment with jurisdiction over the workplace, CDPH, CalOSHA, and NIOSH, immediately upon request, and when required by law.

Accordingly, this County Health Officer Order (Order) continues the requirement for hospitals to report COVID-19 hospitalizations to LACDPH via the COVID-19 Hospitalization Electronic Surveillance System (CHESS).

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE HSO SECTION 120175; CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS (CC.) TILLE 17, SECTIONS 2500, 2501, 2505, 2508; AND LOS ANGELES COUNTY CODE, SECTION 11.04.010 THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES HEALTH OFFICE ORDERS:

- 1) Purpose. COVID-19 continues to spread, change, and pose a risk to persons within Los Angeles County. It remains important to maintain public health surveillance of COVID-19. This Order maintains the requirement that hospitals report COVID-19 hospitalizations to LACDPH via the COVID-19 Hospitalization Electronic Surveil nice System (CHESS). This ongoing hospitalization reporting requirement playides local situational awareness of any changes in COVID-19 infection patterns and levels.
- 2) Intent. The primary intent of this Order is to continue the COVID-19 hospitalization reporting requirements to allow for ongoing situational awareness of COVID-19.

  This Order does not alter any additional COVID-19 reporting obligation under federal or California statutory or regulatory is a continue the COVID-19 hospitalization reporting requirements.
- 3) Interpretation. All provisions of this order must be interpreted to effectuate the purpose and intent of this Order as described above. The summary at the beginning of this Order as well as the headings and subheadings of sections contained in this Order are for convenience only and may not be used to interpret this order. In the event of any inconsistency between the summary, headings, or this order, and the text of this Order, the text will control.
- 4) Facilities Subject to the Grand Street. This Order applies to the following facilities and sites within the County Public Heart surisdiction, as detailed in this Section.
  - a) **Healthcare Nacilities.** Healthcare Facilities subject to this Order include the following facilities of settings:
    - Acute Care Hospitals
- For purposes of this Order, the following terms have the meanings given below:
  - COVID-19. COVID-19 means coronavirus disease 2019, the disease caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus.
  - b) COVID-19 Case. A person who:
    - i) Has a positive viral test (i.e., a PCR or antigen test, including self-administered and self-read tests) for COVID-19 and/or
    - ii) Has a positive COVID-19 diagnosis from a licensed healthcare provider.

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- 6) Hospital Reporting Requirements.
  - a) All hospitals must:
    - Report all COVID-19 positive hospitalized inpatients to LACDPH on a routile basis via the COVID-19 Hospitalization Electronic Surveillance System (CHLS) following updated reporting guidance accessible here:

    - ii) Designate a liaison in their facility to coordinate and communicate with ACDPH regarding COVID-19 CHESS reporting.

- 7) Severability. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or work of this Order or any application of it to any person, structure, gathering, or circumstance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, the such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this Order.
- 8) Amendments to Order. This Order may be revised in the uture or response to evolving public health conditions. Should local COVID-19 conditions was rank the County Health Officer may issue orders that are more protective than the guidance and orders issued by the State Public Health Officer.
- 9) Statutory Authority. This Order is issued presument to California Health and Safety Code (HSC) section 120175; California Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 17, sections 2500, 2501, 2505, 2508; and Los Angeles County Code, settin 11.04.010.
- **10) Effective Date.** This Order shall be some circtive at 12:01am Monday, February 03, 2025, and will continue to be until it is revised, re-cinded, superseded, or amended in writing by the County Health Officer.
