Action Items from Last Meeting: Updates on Mini Grant	 Changes Inc., Crystal Pitts, mini-grant awardee is in the 4th week of collaboration with Girls Club and Best-Start West Athens for food drive distribution. First week 200 food boxes were distributed, 2nd week 300 boxes, 4th week 400 food boxes to families. Best-Start gave produce boxes and Changes did dry food that included pancakes, grits, pasta, etc. Due to the amount of families they received 1 dry food item with their food box. Every week Changes distribution changes, last week they gave interactive activities for families to bond i.e. boardgames, UNO, Twister, Monopoly and dominoes. The prior week cleaning supplies were given out to sanitize their environment. All the food has been given out successful each week without flyers being distributed in the community. It was considered to pass out flyers but is concerned if flyers are made, they will not be enough food boxes for the additional people that will come from passing out flyers. Changes had chosen the senior population to service but was having difficulty because hard to reach them because of the restrictions of the senior living facilities. Mary Lee identified 15 seniors that received gift card instead of the food boxes. Changes purchased branding logo items for WWA- CAP. Items purchased were T-shirts, banners, bags and other items. were also included. Changes purchased more branding items, i.e. banners with CAP logo. Thirty families received \$35 gift card.
