# Community Partnership Council Application - 2022

The Department of Public Health is seeking members to serve on the Los Angeles County Office of Violence Prevention's Community Partnership Council for a 2-year term beginning January 2023.

### **Background**

In February 2019, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors passed a motion establishing a countywide Office of Violence Prevention (OVP) within the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (DPH). OVP, together with community and county partners, developed a comprehensive strategic plan to achieve a vision for a Violence Free LA County. In addition to direction provided by a County Leadership Committee, comprised of leadership from over 25 County Departments, OVP believes community involvement is critical to achieving this collective vision. OVP established a Community Partnership Council (CPC) in 2019 to guide the work of the office and to ensure our work was survivor centered, trauma informed and focused on equity and justice. After the initial term of the CPC, we are opening up applications for interested community members to participate on the Council, to advise, guide and share expertise and input. Current Council members may re-apply for another 2-year term.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities**

20 individuals will serve in an advisory capacity to OVP and will:

- Provide guidance and recommendations to OVP on violence prevention, intervention and healing strategies across multiple forms of violence; resource allocations; policy and practice system change; and other issues as determined by the Community Partnership Council, County Leadership Committee and OVP.
- Help coordinate and integrate existing community violence prevention activities and priorities with county efforts.
- Develop recommendations and plans for collective action towards implementation of priority strategies identified by CPC.
- Contribute to the feedback loop between the community at large and county leadership structure, including OVP, the County Leadership Committee, and the Board of Supervisors.
- Hold OVP accountable to the achievement of its stated goals and objectives and adherence to the vision, mission, values, and guiding principles of the Strategic
- Commit to regular attendance and participation in meetings for a minimum of 2 years.

## **Eligibility**

- Membership is restricted to individuals who live or work in Los Angeles County and represent one or more of the following categories:
  - Networks or coalitions (local, state, or national non-governmental) engaged in violence prevention, intervention or healing work;
  - Representatives of community based or faith based organizations serving individuals impacted by different types of violence including survivors;
  - Community leaders organizing efforts to address violence in specific communities or for a distinct demographic group;
  - Survivors affected by violence, not representing an organization or network.
- City or County employees of Los Angeles (or other government agencies) are not eligible to apply.

#### Selection

- Applications will be accepted by self-nomination for 20 seats on the CPC.
- CPC applications will be reviewed by a selection committee comprised of three community partners (who are not submitting or supporting applications), three County Leadership Committee members, and OVP representatives.
- Applicants will be selected based on eligibility criteria and who represent a diverse spectrum of experiences, communities, and demographics.
- In addition to the 20 self-nominated seats, five members of the CPC will be selected by the Board of Supervisors. Each Board member will select one person who: 1) is a survivor of violence or works in the field of violence prevention and, 2) resides or works in their Supervisorial District
