Protocol	 Bernie Lau (DPH) streamlined the new guide to assist PAC members in organizing workgroups. The protocol outlines the goals, deliverables, roles, and responsibilities of workgroups, and will be shared with SAPC staff for feedback. 	
Public Comments	 Edith Urner (Exodus) inquired about LA County Coroners' data for 2023 showing a decline of overdose rates. Dr. Brian Hurley (DPH) recognized the significance of having overdose rates decline, but also reminded providers that overdose rates remain higher than 2021 levels and that the crisis is ongoing. He further questioned data tracking, informing about incomplete data on overdose reversals and lack of formal reporting for naloxone overdoses. 	
	 Dr. Tsai discussed opportunities to improve oversight and coordination for recovery housing, reiterating SAPC's plan to develop a centralized process for managing recovery housing placement.
