SAGE MANAGEMENT DIVISION UPDATES

Referral and Appointment Disposition Feedback









General Findings

- Majority of Direct to Provider referrals are accepted by the screening provider on the day of or within a few days.
- ASAM and Referral Info drop down options sometimes do not populate because the information was not entered correctly.

ASAM Co-Triage must be completed and finalized by either the counselor or an LPHA, prior to the Referral Connections form.

 Counselors should make sure the ASAM data is present in Sage if it is not populating on the Referral Connections form by clicking on "Refresh Assessment Information" on the ASAM Assessment form.

An Appointment and Referral Disposition <u>IS NOT</u> required

- if the client is accepted on the same day of the screening
- AND "Was patient admitted on first date of contact" is "Yes."

Providers should be checking the Appointment and Referral Disposition view in Sage

- Track appointments made within the last 30 days through 14 days from the current date.
- The Referral ID report is being updated to capture all available information.

Why is it Important for SAPC

- SAPC has an obligation to LA County to ensure those who are providing services to our clients remain in good standing and provide high quality services.
- DHCS also requires that SAPC monitor license status and disciplinary status from various sources, such as DHCS, OIG, relevant boards etc., as part of ongoing credentialing and re-credentialing activities.





Starting today, 10/14/2025, the Sage Access Management Section will begin emailing providers a list of practitioners for licenses and employment verification.

This will help to gain an accurate roster of current providers in the network, which will be used to update the Sage system.

Based on this list, we will be able to accurately track current credentials, expiration dates and employment status in Sage.

Once the data is confirmed and entered by SAPC, providers and SAPC will then have visibility via widgets on current information. (Future functionality)





Current Data Issues

SAPC recently reviewed all current practitioners in Sage and found significant data discrepancies across the network.

Initially, when validating license/certification/registrations from the data in Sage, it appeared that several hundred practitioners were practicing on expired or invalid credentials.

Upon further investigation, it was related to outdated information in Sage.

Several registered counselors changed to a different certifying body, or became certified, which was not updated in Sage.





What Providers Need to Do?

- The Sage Liaison must complete and return the form by 10/31/25.
- The expectation is for the Sage Liaison for your agency to submit an updated SAPC Sage User Creation form via the Sage Help Desk when your staff's credentials change or are renewed.

Why is this needed?

- •This will be critical to minimize denials going forward. SAPC will be implementing controls where services rendered by providers on expired credentials will be denied in Sage.
- •Additionally, services provided by performing providers on expired credentials will be recouped.

Los Angeles Network for Enhanced Services (LANES) Implementation









What is LANES?

The Los Angeles Network for Enhanced Services (LANES) is a Health Information Exchange (HIE) supporting organizations for enhanced health information accessibility and data sharing.

Benefits of LANES:

- Care Coordination between health and behavioral health care providers
- Convenient access to 13 million patients in the LANES network when appropriate consents are in place.
- 80% of local community clinics use LANES

LANES Platform

- Get a patient synopsis connecting you to information from community clinics, hospitals, and other physical health and behavioral health facilities.
- Integration with California's CURES Prescription Drug Database
- Ability to access client information from other LA County Departments including Department of Health Services (DHS) and Department of Mental Health (DMH).





LANES Implementation

- SAPC has a signed contract with LANES to share SUD data in the LANES Portal.
- SAPC's contract includes LANES access to the SAPC Provider network without cost to providers via the Sage EHR system.
- In order to have access to LANES via the Sage EHR system, SAPC contracted providers MUST:
 - Opt-in and sign a no-cost MOU between your agency, LANES, and SAPC.
 - While it is not required that an agency complete the MOU, it is highly encouraged to provide your staff access to the LANES resource.
 - Identify specific users within your agency to be given LANES access.
 - It is recommended that LPHAs and staff that conduct care coordination services have access to LANES
- If agencies do not opt-in and sign the MOU, then:
 - Your agency will not be given access to LANES
 - Clinical information related to clients you served will not be shared with LANES even if the client has signed a Release of Information on file.

Next Steps

- SAPC is finalizing MOU execution procedures with LANES
- Your CPA will reach out to your agency leadership regarding sign the MOU
- If your organization signs the MOU, SAPC's Sage Access Management Section (SAMS) will reach out to your Sage Liaison for staffing lists

Medical Record Printouts









SAPC's Sage Management Division, in conjunction with Netsmart, has been developing a more cohesive and comprehensive method to print medical records.

Printouts of clinical documentation will be available to providers as a "report" that was specifically formatted to match layout of the associated document.

The printouts will include all relevant electronic signatures throughout the documentation process.

 - Problem List/Treatment Plan (Updated in LIVE 10/14/25)

 - Recovery Bridge Housing Discharge
 - Referral Connections
 - Service Connections Log
 - Monthly Activity Report

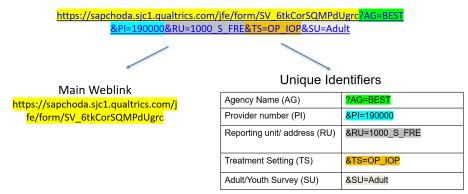
Which Paper Form to Use?

- English and Spanish Version:
 - Use <u>SAPC</u> pre-filled Adult/Youth TPS forms
- Other Languages:
 - Use downloadable versions available at http://publichealth.lacounty.gov/sapc/providers/treatment-perceptions-survey.htm
- Do not use surveys from State/UCLA, due to SAPC's modified items.



How to Access the Online Surveys

- Use the customized provider links that will be emailed to your agency's TPS Committee Member, starting 10/14/25.
- SAPC created links per the unique combination below:
 - Youth or adult version
 - 6-digit CalOMS Treatment Provider ID
 - 10-digit Site address
 - Setting (Early Intervention, OP/IOP, Residential, WM, OTP and Recovery Services).
