



A GROWING PROBLEM

Meth use is becoming more common in LA County, and deaths involving meth are higher than any other drug in LA County. From 2008 to 2019, there were approximately 4,300 meth-related deaths in LA County, with a 66% rise in meth-related deaths from 2017 to 2019. From 2018-2019, more people died from meth overdoses than any other drug in LA County. And, meth is increasingly being found laced with fentanyl, a highly lethal opioid that significantly increases







overdose risk. In addition, meth availability is increasing: from 2012 to 2017, the price of meth dropped 31% nationally. To raise awareness about the dangers of using meth and the help that is available for those who use, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health launched the Meth-Free LA County campaign.








METH IN LA COUNTY AND THE PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS POPULATION

A GROWING PROBLEM

Meth use is becoming more common in LA County, and deaths involving meth are higher than any other drug in LA County. From 2008 to 2019, there were approximately 4,300 meth-related deaths in LA County, with a 66% rise in meth-related deaths from 2017 to 2019. From 2018-2019, more people died from meth overdoses than any other drug in LA County. And, meth is increasingly being found laced with fentanyl, a highly lethal opioid that significantly increases overdose risk.





According to a report released by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health (DPH) in December 2020, drug/alcohol overdose is currently the leading cause of death among **people experiencing homelessness (PEH)** in LA County. To reduce meth's harm among the PEH population, the LADPH adapted the MethFreeLACounty campaign with specific creative placed outdoors (Out Of Home) in areas with high meth-related overdose rates.

SIDE A HEADLINE: Turn the Page on Meth

SIDE A SUBHEAD: Visit MethFreeLACounty.org or call 1-844-804-7500 to find services that are right for you.

SIDE B HEADLINE: If you are using meth, take steps to keep yourself as healthy and safe as possible

SIDE B BODY COPY:

- Use clean needles (if slamming/injecting). Clean needles are available at most retail pharmacies or see below for locations.*
- Use your own pipe to determine the amount before using.
- Set limits about how much and for how long you will use.
- Have a 'buddy' system. This is where you and a friend look out for each other and keep each other safe, try not to use while you're alone.
- Don't mix meth with other drugs (including alcohol).
- Prevent an overdose by carrying naloxone. See below for locations.*
- Test meth for fentanyl by using fentanyl strips. See below for locations.*
- Be safe-sex ready (condoms and water-based lube).
- Do not drive. Meth affects your ability to drive safely.
- Don't hesitate to call 911, if needed. First responders are trained on how to give naloxone.
- Feel protected by the Good Samaritan Law. If you need to call 911, the Good Samaritan Law helps protect you from drug charges when you call for help.

IF YOU ARE USING METH, TAKE STEPS TO KEEP YOURSELF AS HEALTHY AND SAFE AS POSSIBLE

- **USE CLEAN NEEDLES** (if slamming/injecting). Clean needles are available at most retail pharmacies or see below for locations.*
- USE YOUR OWN PIPE to determine the amount before using
- SET LIMITS about how much and for how long you will use
- HAVE A 'BUDDY' SYSTEM. This is where you and a friend look out for each other and keep each other safe, try not to use while you're alone.
- DON'T MIX METH WITH OTHER DRUGS (including alcohol).
- PREVENT AN OVERDOSE BY CARRYING NALOXONE. See below for locations.*
- TEST METH for fentanyl by using fentanyl strips. See below for location
- BE SAFE-SEX READY (condoms and water-based lube).
- . DO NOT DRIVE. Meth affects your ability to drive safely
- DON'T HESITATE TO CALL 911, IF NEEDED. First responders are trained on how

SIDE B BODY COPY:

- Usa jeringas limpias (en caso de inyectar). Las jeringas limpias están disponibles en la mayoría de las farmacias o consulte a continuación para las ubicaciones.*
- Usa tu propia pipa para determinar la cantidad antes de usar.
- Pon límites de cuánto vas a usar y por cuánto tiempo.
- **Ten un sistema de compañeros.** Este es donde tú y un amigo se cuidan el uno al otro y se mantienen seguros. Intenta no usar si estás solo.
- No mezcles el cristal con otras drogas (incluyendo el alcohol).
- Evita una sobredosis teniendo contigo naloxona. Ve abajo para ubicaciones.*
- Hazle pruebas de fentanilo a las drogas (cristal) con el uso de tiras de fentanilo. Ve abajo para ubicaciones.*
- Estar listo para el sexo seguro (condones y lubricantes a base de agua).
- **No manejes.** La metanfetamina afecta tu capacidad para conducir con seguridad. También va en contra de la lev.
- No dudes en llamar al 911, si es necesario. El personal de primeros auxilios está capacitado para administrar naloxona.
- La ley del buen samaritano te protege. Si necesitas llamar al 911, no te preocupes por meterte en problemas. La ley del buen samaritano protege a quien llama y a quien recibe ayuda.






SOCIAL POST 1

POST COPY: Decision-making is one of the areas of the brain seriously hurt by meth use. Meth kills brain cells from the first hit, creating damage that can never be fully repaired.



SOCIAL POST 2

POST COPY: It's hard to focus on your health while using meth. Each use kills brain cells, making it difficult to stop harmful behaviors and impairing your ability to make solid decisions.



SOCIAL POST 3

POST COPY: Meth use PERMANENTLY changes the structure of your brain. Each hit kills brain cells, harming your memory in a way that can never be repaired.

SOCIAL POST 4

POST COPY: People glorify the high from meth, but have you heard about the come down? In reality, meth destroys the wiring in your brain, making it difficult to feel pleasure in the things you used to.



SOCIAL POST 5

POST COPY: When you see others high on meth, you rarely get the full story. No one shares how they feel after the initial high causes depression, apathy, and hopelessness.



SOCIAL POST 6

POST COPY: You may have heard that meth makes the fireworks fly, but you probably didn't hear how it destroys your brain pleasure centers, eventually lowering your ability to experience any pleasure at all.
