


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
Los Angeles in the Nation








U.S. and Foreign-Born TB Cases: LAC 1996-2015






TB Cases by Race/Ethnicity*: LAC 2015






TB Cases by Country of Birth*: LAC 2015






TB Cases Experiencing Homelessness*: LA County 2011-2015





